Safety Update: Car Theft

Did you know that Colorado is ranked #1 in car thefts per capita nationally? That activity is obviously felt in the city and here in Whittier. It's made statewide and national news. But what you probably didn't know are which cars are "popular" targets :

- Hondas, late 90s-early 00s model years
- Chevy/GM Trucks, 06-12 model years
- RAM Trucks, 06-12 model years
- Hyundais, 13-16 model years



Why these? They're comparatively easy to "hot wire" or in more modern terms, their key/ignition assemblies are easier to get around than other cars. Because of that, they become prime targets. Thus, if you ever wondered why somebody's 1999 beater Honda Civic with 200,000 miles on it was stolen, the ease of triggering the ignition is one possible cause.

To prevent car theft, always lock your car. Never leave anything of value visible to somebody walking by. For that matter, never leave anything of value in your car. If you want to be more pro-active, you can install a "vehicle immobilizer system". The actual cost of the hardware isn't much but unless you can work on the car's wiring, you'll need to have somebody install it. Keep yourself safe from car theft this holiday season!

Climate Group Update: Keeping Heat in your House this Winter

When my daughter lived in a condo east of Whittier, I was doing some outside maintenance and noticed that a neighbor had their window open; it was the dead of winter. I don't know the reason they had an open window, but as I passed by, I could feel the rush of warm air. I know that it was more than once, in fact every time I passed that window it was open. Maybe they just liked fresh air. But it seemed to me to be a terrible waste of money—they pay for that heat going out the window. And it is a terrible waste of energy, we burn fossil fuels to heat our homes, those fuels cause our changing climate.

Now, I want you to know that I was polite and when I encountered that neighbor, I never mentioned their open window. I know that plenty of us have leaky homes.

The best way to know if your house is leaky (or better yet, to simply get a handle on where your leaks are) is to get a "blower door test." Someone comes, makes sure that everything is closed as tight as possible, and then sets a big fan in your front door with a seal around the door, and pulls air through the leaks in the house. They then can go through your place and find places where the air leaks. Then you know exactly what to seal. I've seen these services advertised for \$49. You might consider checking with Xcel Energy, they have a list of contractors.

Or, you can close up the house yourself, say on a nice cold day when the air temperature outside is very different than your indoor temperature, and take a lit incense stick around to your windows and doors and see when the smoke moves.

Then there are a good number of fixes you can buy at the hardware stores. One of my favorites is an inexpensive roll of a clay-like stuff that molds into crevasses around windows, and stays in place all winter, but comes off and you throw it away come spring. But there are strips of foam and tapes and other things that can work for you.

In Whittier we usually live in old and leaky homes. Some are so leaky you might as well fling open a window. Tighten up your home and it will save you money, do good by the planet, and keep yourself toasty warm.
